

The charge conference directs the work of the church and gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, elects the members of the church council, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry. (Please note, that while the conference covers the tasks listed above, the work has been done by the church council prior to the conference and church members assemble to vote on what the church council has presented. ALL church members are encouraged to attend.)
