Pastor's Thoughts

Greetings,

Recently Google photos shared with me a “memory.” It was pictures that I had taken in a motel room that didn’t live up to my expectations. Truth is, had there been another motel room available in the town I was in, I wouldn’t have stayed in the room. What was so bad you may ask? Here is my laundry list of items that were wrong: a piece of tile had fallen off the wall near the tub and hadn’t been repaired; while they had installed some new tiling on the floor around the tub (it matched the tiling in the lobby and was actually very nice), they hadn’t secured the carpet at the junction of the tile and carpet; there were nails sticking up through the carpet near the new tile; the toilet wasn’t fully secured to the floor and rocked back and forth; the “hot water” was, at best, warm water; the towel rod was broken; there was a burn hole in the comforter of a non-smoking room.

In my frustration with the room, I missed a greater point – how truly fortunate I am. While I was getting bent out of shape because of (in the big scheme of things) trivial matters with the room I was staying in, there were countless others in our world who didn’t even have a roof over their head. I was warm, I had shelter, I didn’t have to experience the pangs of hunger and yet I was consumed with ire about stupid stuff, “how dare they not secure the carpet, how dare they have a broken towel rod?” Never once did I think of those who might not even have the basics of life.

It is easy for those of us who have necessities of life (food, water, shelter) to forget all about

those who do not. The issues that seemed major to me at the time are really nothing and, in truth, are pretty petty when compared to those who know not where they will lay their head or find their next meal.

In this month of “thanksgiving” I want to encourage us all to demonstrate our gratitude to God by reaching out to those in need. There are lots of ways that we can do this. Just a few examples would include volunteering at a food pantry/organization that serves those in need, buying a cup of coffee or a meal for someone who appears to be in need (always offer though, do not assume). If you need any other ideas, please feel free to contact me.

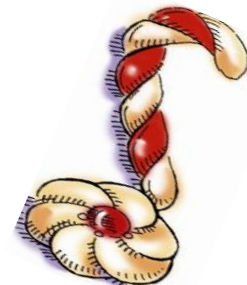
ATTENTION BAKERS!!!

Pastor/Staff-Parish Relations Committee Job Description

RESULT EXPECTED

An effective committee builds a strong positive relationship between staff and congregation so that the congregation makes disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. This committee will work with the lead pastor and other staff to fulfill legal and ethical responsibilities related to staff.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS AND QUALIFICATIONS HELPFUL FOR THE JOB

Individuals on this committee should have one or more of these spiritual gifts: exhortation (encouragement), wisdom, discernment, administration, shepherding, helping, servanthood, and leadership. This committee should be diverse in age, experience, and interests, bringing all interests of the ministry to the attention of the staff. Some experience in human relations, personnel management, and communications is helpful. These individuals must listen well to both staff and people of all ages in the congregation, while keeping a focus on the mission of the church. This committee must be able to maintain confidentiality.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHAIRPERSON

The chair is the congregation's primary connection with the district superintendent and bishop related to the appointed leadership of the congregation. This individual leads the committee by preparing and communicating the agenda for meetings, leading the meetings, and following up on actions by assigning responsibility for implementation. This person should become familiar with United Methodist resources and organizations.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COMMITTEE

- Committee members maintain a healthy and growing personal spiritual life. They engage in biblical and theological reflection about the mission of the church and biblical leadership.
- This committee encourages, strengthens, nurtures, supports, and respects the pastor(s) and staff and their families. They confer regularly about the personnel conditions and issues that affect the congregation's total ministry, including healthy life-work balance. They help the staff set priorities.
- This committee communicates openly and regularly with the pastor(s), staff, and congregation.

In consultation with the lead pastor and with awareness of the strategy of the

church leadership team, this committee recommends needed staff positions and develops and approves written job descriptions and titles for staff.

- This committee recommends compensation, travel, housing, and other financial matters to the church council through the finance committee.
- In consultation with the pastor(s), the committee recommends to the church council a written statement of policy and procedures for hiring, evaluating, promoting, retiring, and dismissing staff members who are not subject to episcopal appointment (procedures must comply with local and state laws).
- This committee is responsible for carrying out, through appropriate agencies, proper screening (including background checks) for lay employees and volunteer staff.
- This committee weighs several factors as it meets with the district superintendent and/or the bishop in an advisory capacity related to clergy leadership. Committee members consider the age and stage of the congregation. They must have an understanding of the feelings and desires within the congregation about the pastor's leadership and appointment. They also consider the culture and needs of the community around the church.

- This committee provides an annual evaluation of the pastor(s) and other staff for ongoing effective ministry.

This committee enlists, evaluates, and annually recommends candidates for professional ministry to the charge conference.

The work of the committee may include sub teams (such as a parsonage committee or a volunteer staff committee). The committee on nominations and leadership development may help identify people for these groups.

- The committee works with the pastor and district superintendent to develop a church profile that reflects the needs, characteristics, and opportunities for mission of the charge consistent with the church's statement of purpose. The profile will be reviewed annually and updated as per paragraphs 427 and 428 in the *Book of Discipline*.

Missions Update



The BUMC Missions Committee met September 20th to discuss the following:

“TLC” (Transitional Living Center), (Kansasville, WI) for abused/homeless women and children. The director, Cristen Chaffe, shared with us, as to the inner workings, provisions, needs, programs and goals of this shelter and its residents, located in the Dover Grade School. Recently, there was a fundraiser at the Low Daily in Burlington to raise money for much needed repairs of this old building. Tours can be arranged for anyone interested.

“SHEPHERDS COLLEGE/HOME” (Union Grove, WI) for the developmentally challenged, was represented by the Ministry & Engagement Officer, Kevin Phillips, who spoke and provided a packet of information to each committee member. Kevin is seeking an ongoing monetary donation from both ESUMC & BUMC. Three years ago, we jointly contributed \$2000.00 each to this worthy mission. This request is tabled for now and will be revisited at a later date. Tours are available upon request.

“NEW LIFE MINISTRIES” (India) – BUMC recently donated \$925.00 toward the rebuilding of areas affected by Christian persecution. The brutalities, fatalities, loss of homes and contents, lack of food and water,

etc., has left 378 families displaced and destitute. Thank you, Doc, and Molly, for handling this transaction through your connections.

“29 yr. old, TAYLOR MALOM” (Burlington, WI), diagnosed in 3rd trimester of her first-born child, with stage 2, Bulky Hodgkin’s Lymphoma, forcing the premature birth of her baby. BUMC donated \$300.00 towards her mounting medical expenses. Thank you, Donna McKusker, for bringing this mission to our attention.

“GHANA LIBRARY and SCHOOL RESTROOMS” (Africa) – Rev. Dr. Ebenezer Inzor, DS and Maggie were in Ghana in August. In my text follow-up with them, I was assured that the library is near completion and a brief video shows the 6 ft./8 ft. white folding tables, as well as our old folding chairs, are in use. He was there orchestrating the placement of the furniture and preparing for the (100) boxes of shipped books which are now ready to be catalogued and placed on the handcrafted wooden bookcases. A formal library opening was scheduled for the end of September in the beginning of their academic year. The school restrooms are still functioning after 7 yrs., with only 2 spouts in need of replacement.

“KARCHER KUPBOARD” (Burlington, WI), is an ongoing mission as presented in the Gathering Area. There is a donation receptacle with lists of the items requested. For additional information, contact Linda or Tom Gianoni at 860.736.4347.
